The third China's Supply Chain Expo (CSCE) 2025 concluded on 20th July, drawing a huge representation from 75 countries across the world in Beijing. This five-day event was more than an exhibition — it was a showcase of deep-rooted philosophy of integration, reliance and a balancing act against the protectionism. Attracting countries of Global South including Central Asian Republics is the long term strategy that is China's unique way of leading the world through inclusiveness and shared future. Although, various connotations are attached to the term "Global South", China has given it more clarity by binding the countries together under the Belt and Road (BRI) Initiative through economic cooperation.

It has been proved successful with the widespread participation of enterprises from across the world, showing up to the CSCE 2025. This year, the Global South has seen a determined global economic force, as China which can reset both regional and global governance systems. Multiple agreements were signed among the developing countries of Global South at the CSCE 2025 with a surge in participation and networking from all parts of world including Europe, Africa, Latin America, Asia and Central Asian Republics.
